### Now - October 18, 2022

#### 1. Add 10 more friends to your contact list or recruit more Ambassadors for 2022.

Or do both! Relational organizing only works because you do. The more you tap into your networks, the bigger the impact on voter turnout across the state. If you have friends who want to participate, send them to one of our <u>weekly Zoom training sessions</u>!

## 2. Make sure your friends are registered to vote by October 18!

This is easy at <u>KSVotes.org.</u> The voter registration deadline is **October 18** Your friends who will be 18 by Nov. 18 can register to vote! Everyone else should check their registration, especially if they have moved or changed their name.

# 3. Help your friends sign up to Vote-by-Mail as soon as possible!

Anyone can request to vote-by-mail in Kansas, and we think everyone should! We suggest folks request their ballot at <u>KSVotes.org</u> before the voter registration deadline, but you can technically request a mail-in-ballot up until November 01. Voting by mail is everything!

# 4. Encourage your friends to vote early!

## Turn in that mail-in ballot

Did you talk your friends into voting by mail? Follow up to make sure they feel comfortable filling it out, and have a stamp! Voters who requested ballots will start getting them around **October 20** so check in then.

#### Vote early in-person

Early voting locations will be on <u>KSBallot.org</u> by the time early voting starts on <u>October 19</u>. The first day of Saturday voting in many counties will be on <u>October 22</u>. <u>This video</u> shows you where to find this info on KSBallot.

## 5. Help your friends know who and what is on their ballot

Once you know exactly how they intend to vote, send them to **KSBallot.org** to research who and what will be on their ballot.

#### November 08, 2022 - Election Day!

## 7. Get those stragglers to the polls on election day!

Most polling locations open at 7am, although Sedgwick County (and maybe others) open at 6am. All polls close at 7pm, and those locations are also at KSBallot.org.

Use your Voter to Voter contact list to see who still needs to vote, and call them to make sure they have a plan to get it done!
