**EMAIL 1** : Send the week of October 3, 2022

**There was record turnout in the August elections. Let's do it again.**

There is an election in Kansas on August 2nd that every registered voter can participate in. Follow these three simple steps to get prepared.

- 1. Make sure you're registered.** The deadline for Kansas voter registration is **October 18**. You can see if you're already on the list, sign up to vote, or request an advance ballot online. [Go to KSVotes.org now](https://www.ksvotes.org).
- 2. Find out who is on your ballot and make a plan to vote.** We'd recommend two, nonpartisan websites for learning more about what will be on the ballot. [KSBallot.org](https://www.ksballet.org) and [Vote411.org](https://www.vote411.org).
- 3. Help turn out your family and friends.** Our partner, The Voter Network, has a tool called Voter to Voter, that can easily help you to get your friends and family out to vote. Learn more here. [Sign up for Voter to Voter today](https://www.votertovoter.org).

**EMAIL 2**: Send the week of October 17, 2022

**Have you made a plan to vote?**

There is an election in Kansas on August 2. Have you made a plan to vote?

Early voting will open across the state this week, and some counties even offer Saturday voting between now and election day. You can find those locations, hours of operation, and even make a calendar reminder to add to your schedule at [KSBallot.org](https://www.ksballet.org). If you are voting by mail, ballots should be mailed to homes starting October 19. Watch your mailbox and be sure to return your ballot as soon as you can.

Not sure who to vote for? Again, you can find resources at [KSBallot.org](https://www.ksballet.org). When doing your research, think about the issues that matter to you and where your candidate stands.

Now that you have everything you need to vote, why not **bring your family and friends along!** Voters are 10x more likely to vote if they hear about an election from someone they trust. And there is so little information out there about these local races, they may not be hearing from anybody! We recommend you get started by just sharing the election date and a link to a ballot guide.

**EMAIL 3:** Send the week of October 25, 2022

**Have you voted? Check out [KSBallot.org](#) for the tools you need to vote.**

Election day is around the corner and there are three easy ways you can vote.

1. Vote early this week or on Saturday. Find out locations and hours at [KSBallot.org](#). You can also study up on candidates at [Vote411.org](#).
2. If you have a mail-in-ballot and you haven't turned it in, either put it in the mail ASAP or take it to an early voting location or dropbox.
3. Vote on Election Day. Find out where your polling location is at [KSBallot.org](#).
