Four things you can do in the thirty days before the election

The general elections are on November 5th this year. Every Kansas voter will have a primary ballot to vote on this year, with candidates vying for their party's candidacy in the following races:



Primary elections are the chance for voters to select which candidates will represent their party in the upcoming General election. In 2020, only 30% of registered voters participated in the Kansas primary elections. That means way too few people are deciding which candidates make it to the General election. [Our organization] is working hard to increase voter participation this year - will you join us? Here are three easy things **you** can do to make sure your voice is heard.

1. Check your registration status. [KSVotes.org](https://ksvotes.org) makes registering to vote or checking your registration status simple. **October 15th** is the last date to register! Make sure your friends and family are registered as well.

2. Get to know your ballot. You might know the presidential candidates, but there are a lot of other important seats up for grabs on your ballot this year. [KSBallot.org](https://ksballot.org) lets you read about the candidates and the issues on your ballot so that you're prepared when you hit the polls.

3. Vote as early as you can! Don't wait until Election Day to vote. Every county in Kansas offers in-person early voting, and if you requested an advance ballot (which you can do at [KSVotes.org](https://ksvotes.org)), get it mailed back in quickly, or drop it off. [KSBallot.org](https://ksballot.org) has all of the early voting sites and ballot drop box locations listed.

4. Help turn out your family and friends. We know you're going to vote, but democracy works best when we all participate. Can you commit to getting ten people to vote with you this year? Voter to Voter is a nonpartisan, Kansas-based voter turnout initiative that gives you the tools and support to turn out all your people this election (and track your progress!).
